## FEATHER & FAN SCARF DUO

Two scarves that are perfect for beginning laceknitters: both use variations of the pattern called "Feather and Fan." It produces an elegant-looking lace, yet is easy to memorize and only one row requires decreases and yarn-overs. The samples are shown in hand-painted yarns, but there's plenty of room to play with colors and yarns to suit your fancy.

### ANNE FEATHER & FAN SCARF

#### SIZE

One size fits most adults  
Finished measurements approx. 6 inches  
x 60 inches

#### MATERIALS

approx. 550 yds. fingering-weight yarn  
size US #7 (4.5mm) needles (or size to  
obtain gauge)

Model shown in Schaefer Yarns Anne, 60%  
superwash merino, 25% mohair, 15% nylon, 560  
yds./4 oz. skein

#### GAUGE

approx. 10 sts = 1 inch over lace pattern  
(which looks more intimidating than it is,  
due to the wavy nature of the pattern)

#### PATTERN

CO 60 sts. Knit 6 rows. Now work in  
Pattern Stitch, as follows:

Row 1: K3, \*k2tog 3 times, (yo, k1) 6  
times, k2tog 3 times; rep from \* until 3 sts  
remain, k3.  
Row 2: K3, purl to last 3 sts, k3.  
Row 3: K.  
Row 4: K.



Rep rows 1 through 4 until work measures approx. 60", ending with Row 2. Knit 6 rows. Bind off. Weave in ends & block.

## **FEATHER & FAN STRIPED SCARF**

### **SIZE:**

One size fits most adults.  
Finished measurements approx. 6 inches  
x 50 inches

### **MATERIALS:**

Model shown in Koigu Premium Merino and Koigu Painter's Palette Premium Merino, 100% wool, 176 yds./50g skein (3 skeins of nearly-solid, 2 skeins multi)

### **GAUGE:**

approx. 9 sts = 1 inch over lace pattern

### **LACE PATTERN:**

Row 1: K.  
Row 2: P.  
Row 3: \*K2tog three times, (yo, K1) six times, k2tog three times, repeat from \*.  
Row 4: K.

### **PATTERN:**

CO 54 sts with color A. Work Lace Pattern for a total of 25 repeats. Change to color B and work 25 more repeats. Change to color C and work 12 repeats, then work Rows 1 & 2 only. Set aside on holder or extra needle.

Cast on 54 sts with color E. Work Lace Pattern for a total of 25 repeats. Change to color D and work 25 more repeats. Change to color C and work 12 repeats, then work Rows 3 & 4 only.

Use Kitchener Stitch to graft the two sections together. Weave in ends, then block.

approx. 175 yds. of fingering-weight yarn in each of five different colors *[Note: Scarf in one color requires approx. 525 yds. of fingering-weight yarn; three-color variation requires one 50-g/175 yd. skein of each color; scarf as shown will use approx. 28g of each 50g skein.]*

size US #3 (3.25mm) needles (or size to obtain gauge)  
tapestry needle  
stitch holder or spare needle

### Variations:

- \* Work entire scarf in one color (see yardage requirements above).
- \* Work scarf in three colors (see yardage requirements above): Work first section in color A until it runs out, then work in color B until half the skein is used up, ending with Row 2. Work second section in color C until it runs out, then work in color B until it is used up, ending with Row 4. Graft and finish as described above.
- \* Use five colors, but change colors every inch or so at the end of a pattern repeat.
